It is plenty deep for over-winter stays but our "snow-bird" koi have 2 condos (150

Ogon

There are several varieties of Ogon and they all fall into the class of Hikari Muji-Mono. Hikari means metallic or shiny, Muji means single color and mono means one's (i.e. fish). Because these fish are one color, the emphasis is on conformation of body shape, quality of the metallic sheen (luster), clarity of the head, and the even coloration and alignment of the scales. The fins are the same color as the body and this color depth should be even across the fins. The traditional Ogon is gold but there are several color variations, the most common one being the Yamabuki Ogon. Other colors include the Orenji (orange), Purachina (platinum) and Nezu (silver grey).



Yamabuki (yellow) Ogon

Although nominally a single color metallic grouping, there is one deviation from that. When an Ogon has dark centers to its scales, it becomes known as a Matsuba Ogon. Matsuba scalation gives the impression of a pinecone. The Matsuba variants are Gin (silver) and Kin (gold). The feature to appreciate here is the pinecone scalation. The dark scale centers should be clearly defined and the scales should be evenly distributed over and along the top of the body and down below the lateral line



Purachina (platinum) Ogon

Hikari Moyo-mono

Hikari Moyo-mono is the class name for a metallic koi with two or more colors. Examples are Kujaku, Hariwake and Yamatonishiki.

This Kujaku is a two color metallic koi with Matsuba scalation. This fish has good body volume and a lovely clear head. Lustrous skin quality and scale alignment are vital in metallic fish.



GLOSSARY

Gin – Silver

Hariwake – A metallic koi with orange or yellow pattern in a white background.

Hikari – Metallic

Kin - gold

Kujaku – A metallic koi with a red pattern on a white base and exhibiting matsuba scalation.

Matsuba – scales that are black in the center giving an overall appearance of a pinecone on a metallic fish.

Mono – one's (as in one fish)

Muji – one color

Nezu – grey

Ogon – single color metallic koi

Orenji – orange


Purachina – platinum or metallic white koi

Yamabuki – yellow

Yamatonishiki – metallic sanke

BE and the Surgery

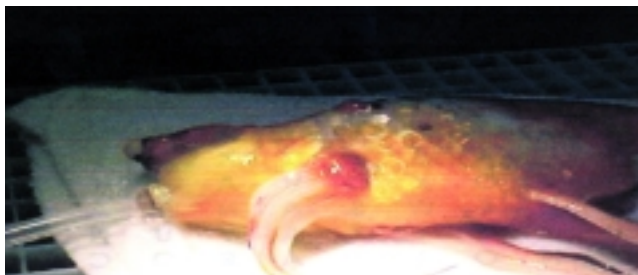
BE is my goldfish, BE is short for Bulgy Eye, and in July we discovered that he had a growth on his side. He has had a dermatitis condition on and off for some time where he develops cysts. These have been removed through prior surgeries, which ended up being sterile cysts for the most part.



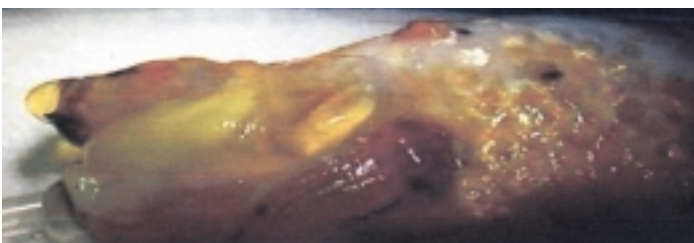
When the growth started on his side I thought it might be another cyst but it didn't look right and we had no way of knowing what the growth was until we received the pathology report. Dr. Helen Roberts of Five Corners Animal Hospital performed the surgery in Orchard Park, NY.

The first thing that Dr. Roberts said about BE was "Oh my God! He has gotten huge." It turns out that the last time he saw Dr. Roberts was June 12, 2004 and he weighed in at 135 grams or 4.7 ounces. The day of his surgery, July 22, 2005 he weighed 250 grams or 8.8 ounces. He had doubled his weight during the past year. I believe his weight gain is due to the Mazuri gel food that I have been feeding him.

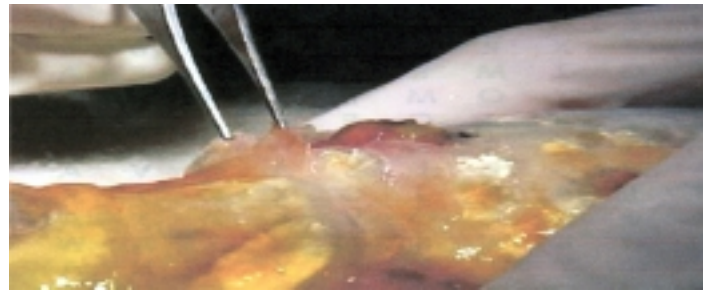
BE was sedated with a solution of Finquell with an equal amount of baking soda to buffer it. The anesthesia tube was inserted in his mouth so the



Finquell solution could be pumped over his gills while surgery was performed.



Next the growth was swabbed with betadine and a few scales were removed from the surgical area.



The growth starts to be removed.



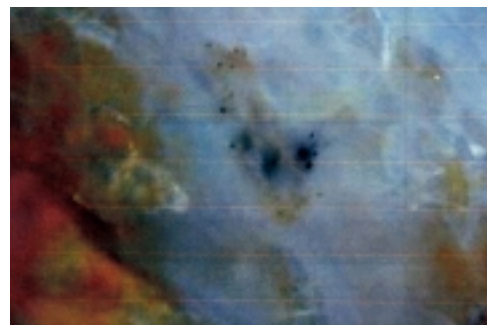
Here is a portion of the growth removed. Finally the surgery is finished. Pressure is applied to stop any bleeding and the incision is wiped with betadine. The



patient recovered very quickly. Three days after surgery. Then the bottom picture, One week after surgery.



When the pathology report came back it was diagnosed as a malignant melanoma. It was very close to the abdominal wall and Dr Roberts was concerned about cutting into the abdominal wall when she was removing the growth. There was talk about giving him chemo but we decided that he should be left alone. Up to this point he has been doing very well for the most part and the growth has not come back.
