RULE #1 ALL ITEMS SUBMITTED FOR SALE MUST BE LISTED ON THE OFFICIAL SALE SHEET.

Do not # the items, numbers will be assigned as the items arrive at the meeting. Each seller will be given numbered stickers to be attached to each item. PLEASE make sure #;s correspond to the item # as listed on the sheet. Seller's money will be credited against any items bought, any money due to sellers over \$50 will be paid by check within 1 week of the sale.

Unlimited number of items per member, 50-50 split _____ to seller, _____ to NFKPC, Please note any minimum bids, All items must be in containers and CLEAN. NO Leaky pots will be accepted for sale.

All buyers must be Pre-Registered and use buyers #, Money will be collected at half-time and after everything is sold. PLEASE DO NOT interrupt the people who are keeping score.

Each item will be brought to the sales associate with a "chit". It will list the item #, a brief description, sales price & the buyer number. When the item is delivered to the buyer, the buyer will initial the chit & it will be returned to the sales table for processing.

List any information about the item, i.e. perennial, annual, sun, shade, color, height. It will sell better if the members know what they are buying. Do not rely on the sales associate to know.

We will need volunteers to keep track of the sale amounts and/or run the items to the buyers. If you can help in any area for all or part of the sale, please see the sales committee before the meeting.
