## Koi Person of the Year 2013

Phil first joined the NFKPC back in 1995.

Believe it or not, when he first joined "Mr. Koi" had no Koi! His late brother Bruce encouraged Phil to take the plunge and get into keeping Koi.

At the time he joined there were only 3 club members that kept Koi – Tom Tower,

Jim Jacobs, and Ray Lucas.

Phil's first pond was built in 1996. Although an adequate home for Koi, he was not satisfied in its design. The more he read, and talked with other Koi keepers, the more he knew it needed to be redesigned.

This led to a total redesign of the pond, with removal of all water plants from the pond itself, increasing its depth to 6 feet, installing bottom drains that feed sumps which are housed in a concrete bricked based building, adding bead filters, etc. The building was constructed to represent a Japanese tea house, and his garden was landscaped according to Japanese principles.

Phil has been active in the NFKPC, having served on its board of directors, and having held office as the club's vice president.

He has actively participated in the annual Koi show for a number of years, many of which he served as chairperson for the event.

Phil worked with 2 other club members to create the pond in the Creative Gardens at Riverview Elementary School in Tonawanda.

He has helped maintain the ponds at the Erie county fairgrounds, Reinstein Woods, and the Buffalo & Erie County Botanical Gardens.

Phil has always been willing to share his knowledge with others, to help them advance their Koi keeping skills.

This year's award is long overdue to this behind the scenes leader, who has contributed much over the years to our club, and Koi keeping in By Greg Young general.


