Doitsu (Doh-Eet-Sue)


Kohaku

This koi has a German ancestry. These fish were imported to Japan during the late 1800's as a food source. They was developed from a scaleless carp. This koi can range from no scales at all sometimes called a "leather carp" (Kawas-gou), or may be called a "mirror carp" (Kagami-goi), if they have one line of scales following their lateral and dorsal lines. But like with anything there are exceptions. Some may appear to be wearing a suit of armor or large scales on their shoulder region. The fact that they do not have scales covering their whole body means their markings need to be sharp. Some even say they appear to glow from a light within. Photo credits:
